My Answer **By BILLY GRAHAM**

QUESTION: I am trying to live for God, but I don't read my Bible and pray as I should. I meditate and try to pray but I cannot find the

proper words. There is so much I don't understand in the Bible. Does God really require us to pray good prayers and be devoted Bible readers to be saved? - J. M.

ANSWER: This may seem strange, but I think you are trying too hard. The secret of the Christian life is trusting, not trying.

Your salvation depends upon the extent to which you trust the Lord Jesus to forgive your sins, to give you eternal life and to fill you with His Spirit. He has promised to do all this for you - and much more and you must trust Him to keep His word. You must learn to trust Jesus every moment of every day. Your whole Christian life should be one of growing trust in the Lord to meet your every need.

The same is true of prayer and Bible reading. It is the Lord who inspires us in prayer and enables us to understand the Bible, for it is His Word. BUT IT SEEMS AS THOUGH YOU ARE TRYING TO DO IT ALL BY YOURSELF.

Start by trusting Jesus to keep His promise in Revelation 3:20, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock, if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me." Think of that door as being the entrance to your life. Jesus is on the outside. Open your life up to Him and ask Him to come in and fill you with His Spirit. That is a prayer of trust.

In the same way, trust Jesus to help you in prayer and with the Bible. Ask Him for that help every time you pray or read. Your prayers do not have to be well thought out or carefully worded. Prayer is a conversation between you and God - talk to Him just as naturally as you would to anyone else.

When you read the Bible think of it as God's word to you. Don't always try to analyze it or understand it all - just look for one simple thought that you can believe, and make that God's message for you for that day.
