

CHARLES HENRY HALL
Married
ANN CATHERINE LITTLEJOHN

CHARLES HENRY HALL WAS BORN ON 24 April 1809. He became an Anglican Minister of Religion and in 1839 became rector of St. John and later of St. Paul. He was one of twins but his sister Isabella Ann Hall died young and the name Isabella was re-used in 1814 for Isabella Sophia Hall. Charles died in 1882.

ANN CATHERINE LITTLEJOHN was born on 1810 daughter of Alexander Littlejohn and Anne de la Pierre Bennet and sister of the Rev. David Reiusel Littlejohn.

Charles and Ann had 5 children –

Caleb lived at Breezy Castle – 2 St, Andrews Lane and was an Accountant at the Colonial Bank.

Miss Ethel Littlejohn was a frequent visitor to Arnold Road – she lived in the Verley Home on Duke Street. Don't know where she fits in.

Charles Henry Hall married and went to the States.

When he died his wife, MAY, took his urn to Jamaica where it was buried in the Family Plot at Half Way Tree Cemetery – she returned to Middlesex, Manchester where she lived until her death.

David Bailey Hall and his wife Claire also frequent visitors to Arnold – they lived in Canada for time. He was nicknamed “King” which everyone called him!

Duncan Hamilton Hall entered Public Service as a copyist in the Colonial Secretary's office in 1891 and was promoted to First Class Clerk in 1913.

Sarah and Catherine were the daughters of Duncan Hamilton – don't know mother's name.

Other names found – William (1837-1850), Martha, Charles William (1848). Apparently Catherine was just a baby when her mother died and Martha, the eldest, would have had to practically raise the younger ones.

Edward and Sarah married in 1874 in Kingston, Jamaica - they had 3 children -

Mervis was a Nurse – she lived in England for a time with her husband, Hugh.

Arthur and Nora had no children.

Phyllis never married.

Arthur and Haidee had 3 children

Married on 19 Dec 1937 to KATHLEEN FAY SAVAGE
Children – FAY, NICHOLAS, ALLEYNE, ELIZABETH
EVELYN (EVE)HALLmarried REGINALD PHILPOTTS
Children – CAROLINE - and NICHOL.

Notes: Arthur and Haidee owned “Ravensworth” a beautiful home in Spanish Town – it was sold and is now St. Jago Boys School.

Not been able to get any info on PEARL and her husband. However there are several Pictures of DORIS and SYBIL at Breezy Castle – owned by the Hamiltons and Halls – along with some of the Aitkens.

Edith was a Music Teacher and spent many days at Arnold Road.

Donald worked at Shell and spent a lot of time at Arnold Road.

CATHERINE ANN HALL (1854-1912)

CHARLES COLQUHOUN AITKEN (1 Aug 1858-21 Nov 1931)

Charles and Catherine married on 7 Jan 1879 At St. Andrews Parish Church on Jamaica. Thy lived in Spanish Town at “Olde Yron Gayte”. They had 8 children –

Notes: Charles Henry (Harry) went to Cuba and worked with Bank of Nova Scotia – came back to Ja. and lived at Arnold Road. He and Hannah did not have any children.
Violet and Charles James had 2 sons – Charles William(Billy)Hay(1907-1916) died when he was 8 years old – he had diabetes and Robert (Bobby) Hay (1915-1977).
Eric worked in the Colonial Service and eventually became Auditor General.
Leonard served in Egypt during WW1 – afterwards went to Guatemala and worked as an overseer in a Plantation of the United Fruit Company – married Sebastiana Osorio and had two children - Daysee (Nina) Mary Aitken (1928) and Leonard Colquhoun Aitken(1929-1992).
Dermot died before I knew him.
Victor and Elizabeth lived in Canada – when he died she spent nearly 2 years with us. They did not have any children.
Aubrey and Roslyn had 8 children – Stanley (1925-1986;Pearl;Doris;Irma;Dottie;Eric; Daisy;Violet.
Marguerite was an artist – she studded in Edinburgh when she was a girl. In 1950 she went to England and lived in London – and started her art seriously – she was able to sell many of her paintings. She was really happy there until she became ill and Bobby who lived in Scotland insisted she come to live with them. She died there in 1981.

Notes: Charliana was born in Inch, County Down, Northern Ireland. She married the Rev.Dr.Hugh Croskery,- son of Hugh Croskery and Charal Wallace Brown - on 19 Jul 1859 in Clarenton, Jamaica.
In 1880 the family left Jamaica for British Guiana
He worked at the Anglican Mission amongst the East Indians for about 6 years before dying in 1886. Charliana and the children returned to Jamaica.
